Michael Stanley Byczek was the son of Martin Byczek and Maryanna Dudek. He was born in the Bridgeport neighborhood of Chicago, IL on August 3, 1917 while his parents were living at 1362 W. Fuller. The family lived in a few different buildings near Hillock and Short during Michael's youth, but are most associated with the two-flat they owned at 2816 S. Short. Michael was baptized at St. Barbara Catholic church. The Byczek surname is known as amongst the earliest Polish settlers in Bridgeport. Several of Martin Byczek and Maryanna (Dudek) Byczek's aunts and uncles had arrived in Bridgeport during the 1880s. The middle name of Stanley is attributed to his uncle Stanley Dudek who had lived with the family on Short Street. Prior to World War II, Michael had various jobs, such as at local factories and as a "hustler" for a printing company. Martin and Maryanna Byczek owned a farm in Roselawn, Indiana during the 1940s. They and their children, including Michael, divided their time between Bridgeport and the Indiana farm.

Marie Catherine Flanagan was born on August 3, 1923. Michael and Marie shared the same birthday. Marie was the daughter of Martin J. Flanagan and Marie T. Talbot. Martin Flanagan was a World War I veteran who served in France with the 23rd Engineers, known as the Road Builders of the American Expeditionary Forces. Marie Talbot's grandparents, William and Julia Rooney, were prominent early settlers of Chicago dating back to 1835. The name Marie is attributed to her mother and middle name of Catherine for her grandmother Kittie Rooney who married Edward H. Talbot at Holy Name Cathedral in 1880. Marie Flanagan had a twin sister Anna, named for Martin's mother, who passed away shortly after birth. Marie was born while the family lived at 3029 W. 41st Street in the Brighton Park neighborhood. She was baptized at St. Agnes Catholic church, also in Brighton Park. Marie's godfather was Edward Rooney, her mother's first cousin, who was the deputy clerk of the former Chicago Municipal Court when his brother John J. Rooney was a judge. The Flanagan family briefly lived in Gage Park prior to settling in Bridgeport, the neighborhood where Marie Talbot had lived with her uncle John Rooney for about 14 years prior to her marriage to Martin Flanagan. Marie Flanagan's employment was typically part-time "on-demand" work (as would be described in today's economy), such as a cashier and where help was needed in local businesses (i.e. tavern).

Michael S. Byczek served in the Army during World War II as a Private First Class with the 81st Division (Infantry), known as the "Wildcats". The Wildcats were involved with military operations on the Pacific islands of Angaur and Peleliu. Michael operated a machine gun in the Heavy Weapons company (M) of the 3rd Battalion in the 321st Regiment. He was injured during an amphibious maneuver while training in New Caledonia when the Wildcats were on route to the Philippines. One of his fingers was amputated after medical treatment was unsuccessful. Michael remained in the Army for the duration of the war engaged in light duties as a result of the injury. He had joined the military on June 18, 1942 at the age of 24 and was discharged on January 18, 1946 (28 years old). Upon returning home to Chicago, Michael S. Byczek worked for the State of Illinois as a grain inspector. He remained in that position through retirement.

Michael S. Byczek (33) and Marie Flanagan (27) were married at St. Bridget's in Bridgeport on November 4, 1950. The Flanagan apartment located at 2888 S. Archer and Martin Byczek's home on Hillock and Bonfield was about two blocks apart on opposites sides of railroad tracks. Michael was temporarily living in McKinley Park with his brother near 36th and Marshfield during this period, but also spent time with his father on Hillock. Michael S. and Marie Byczek had four children. Their eldest, a son, Michael M. Byczek married Betty A. Bykowski in 1974 at St. Helen's in the Ukrainian Village neighborhood. They are Michael E. Byczek's parents.

From Marie (Flanagan) Byczek's perspective, her father, husband, and eldest son Michael M. Byczek (Naval reserves) all served in the military.

Michael S. Byczek had the nickname "Gooey Sam" after a local restaurant, which was also shortened to just "Sam". Marie (Flanagan) Byczek was also called "Maggie". They initially lived at 2917 S. Bonfield after the wedding in 1950 and spent a few years next door at 2921 S. Bonfield prior to purchasing a home at 2520 S. Stark. Michael's father and Marie's mother both passed away while living at the Stark Street residence. Michael S. and Marie Byczek acquired ownership of a tavern and banquet hall on Lyman and Farrell, which they operated from about 1965-1972 under the name "Marie's Tap". The original house that had been on the property, and later moved, was the site of St. Mary of Perpetual Help's first church in the 1880s. Michael's parents Martin Byczek and Maryanna Dudek were married at the present-day site of the church in 1907 near 32nd and Morgan.

Marie (Flanagan) Byczek's great-grandfather Thomas Talbot ran a saloon in the South Loop on 17th and Wentworth at the time of the 1871 Chicago Fire. It is where her grandfather Edward Talbot lived at the time of his 1880 wedding to Kittie Rooney at Holy Name Cathedral. Michael M. Byczek, great-grandson of Edward Talbot, was living at his parent's tavern in Bridgeport when he met his future wife Betty Bykowski.

The Byczek family left Bridgeport during the 1970s after the property on Lyman and Farrell was sold in 1973. They lived in a few different houses prior to purchasing a home at 2242 W. Garfield Blvd in the Gage Park neighborhood in 1975.

Michael M. and Betty Byczek purchased a two-flat at 2939 S. Bonfield in Bridgeport in 1979. Michael S. and Marie Byczek moved into an apartment on the first floor shortly after their grandson Michael E. Byczek was born in 1980. Their home on Garfield was sold in 1981. Michael S. and Marie Byczek remained at 2939 S. Bonfield until 1986 when unexpected medical and health challenges altered their long-term plans. Both returned to 2939 S. Bonfield on an intermittent basis.

Michael S. Byczek passed away in Oak Lawn, IL on December 17, 1992 at the age of 75. Marie (Flanagan) Byczek passed away on March 5, 1996, also in Oak Lawn. She was 72 years old. Both of their funerals were held at St. Barbara in Bridgeport. They are buried together at Resurrection Cemetery in Justice, IL in the Martin and Maryanna Byczek family plot.

Byczek and Flanagan Families on Bonfield Street

There is a unique connection between the Byczek and Flanagan families with Bonfield Street in the Bridgeport neighborhood of Chicago. Bonfield Street is three blocks in length from Hillock to 31st St.

Michael S. Byczek and Bonfield Street

The Martin and Maryanna Byczek family lived at 2734 S. Bonfield St. during the 1930s. Martin lived at 2726 S. Hillock Ave. after Maryanna's death in 1949 through the early 1960s, located at the T-intersection with Bonfield Street. Several members of the Byczek family lived on or near the intersection of Bonfield throughout the decades.

Michael S. and Marie Byczek lived at 2917 S. Bonfield St. after the wedding, where their son Michael M. Byczek was born. The family moved next door at 2921 S. Bonfield St. where they resided for the next few years. Michael M. Byczek returned to Bonfield Street in 1979 when he and his wife Betty (Bykowski) Byczek purchased a two-flat located at 2939 S. Bonfield, where their children Michael E. Byczek and Katherine S. Byczek were born. Michael S. and Marie Byczek lived in the building during the 1980s and 1990s. As of 2025, Michael M. and Betty Byczek still reside in the same building after 46 years along with their son Michael E. Byczek.

All three generations of Michael Byczek have a Bonfield Street birth certificate. Maryanna (Dudek) Byczek filed a delayed birth certificate for her son Michael S. Byczek in 1935 while the family lived at 2734 S. Bonfield. The address for her grandson Michael M. Byczek's birth certificate was 2917 S. Bonfield in 1951. Her great-grandson Michael E. Byczek's birth certificate was 2939 S. Bonfield in 1980. Both Michael M. Byczek and his son Michael E. Byczek were baptized at St. Bridget's, the same church where Michael S. Byczek and Marie Flanagan were married in 1950. Michael S. Byczek was his grandson Michael E. Byczek's godfather at the baptism.

Marie C. Flanagan and Bonfield Street

The Martin and Marie Flanagan family also have a unique connection to Bonfield Street.

Marie (Talbot) Flanagan filed a delayed birth certificate for her daughter Marie in 1943 while the family lived at 2856 S. Archer. The building was located on Archer at the T-intersection with Bonfield.

Michael S. Byczek and Marie C. Flanagan both had delayed birth certificates filed when their families lived on (or at the intersection of) Bonfield Street. All three generations of Byczek and Flanagan families have a Bonfield Street birth certificate: Michael S. Byczek & Marie (Flanagan) Byczek, Michael M. Byczek, and Michael E. Byczek.

Both Martin Flanagan and Marie (Talbot) Flanagan's funerals were held at St. Bridget's church.

When Martin Flanagan passed away in 1947, the family lived at 2888 S. Archer, which was in a block of buildings on the corner of Archer and Bonfield (the street is offset north and south of Archer). All four Flanagan generations have lived within one-half block of Archer and Bonfield at some point between the early 1940s and present-day: Martin Flanagan & Marie (Talbot) Flanagan, Marie (Flanagan) Byczek, Michael M. Byczek, and Michael E. Byczek.





Michael S. and Marie Byczek purchased the property at 2881 S. Farrell about 1965, which included a tavern with banquet hall and a residence. They primarily remained at the property until it was sold in 1973. For instance, they briefly lived around the corner in 1971.

The original two-flat on the property was used as the first church for St. Mary of Perpetual Help in the 1880s before the building was moved to the church's current site near 32nd and Morgan.

Albin Rutkowski built the tavern and banquet hall at 2881 Farrell in 1911 and was the first tavern keeper at that location.



HISTORY OF ST. MARY OF PERPETUAL HELP PARISH

No history of any parish would be complete without enumerating the many incidents causing its founding. The same holds true for our parish.

In September, 1882, the Polish residents of this area held a meeting in a frame building located at Bonfield near 31st Street to decide about securing funds to build a church. It was voted upon to run a raffle. Frank Smuczynski offered one of his mules as a prize or a cow if the winner chose not to accept the mule. The raffle produced over \$200 and in May 1883 the group made a down payment on a two story frame building located at the northeast corner of Lyman and Farrell streets. The inside walls were removed and replaced with arches to support the second floor. This structure served as a combination Church, school and Sisters' home for the Polish families of Bridgeport.

In this building, the Rev. Adolph Snigurski, pastor of St. Adalbert's church held the first divine services on July 17, 1883.

During the weekdays a curtain was drawn across the altar to provide for two class rooms. The front of the second floor was also used as a class room. The rear four rooms were used as living quarters for the Felician Sisters, the first teachers in our parish.

The 75th Anniversary Book for St. Mary of Perpetual Help described the original location on Lyman and Farrell






