

## **Martin Paluch and Francisca Stachacz**

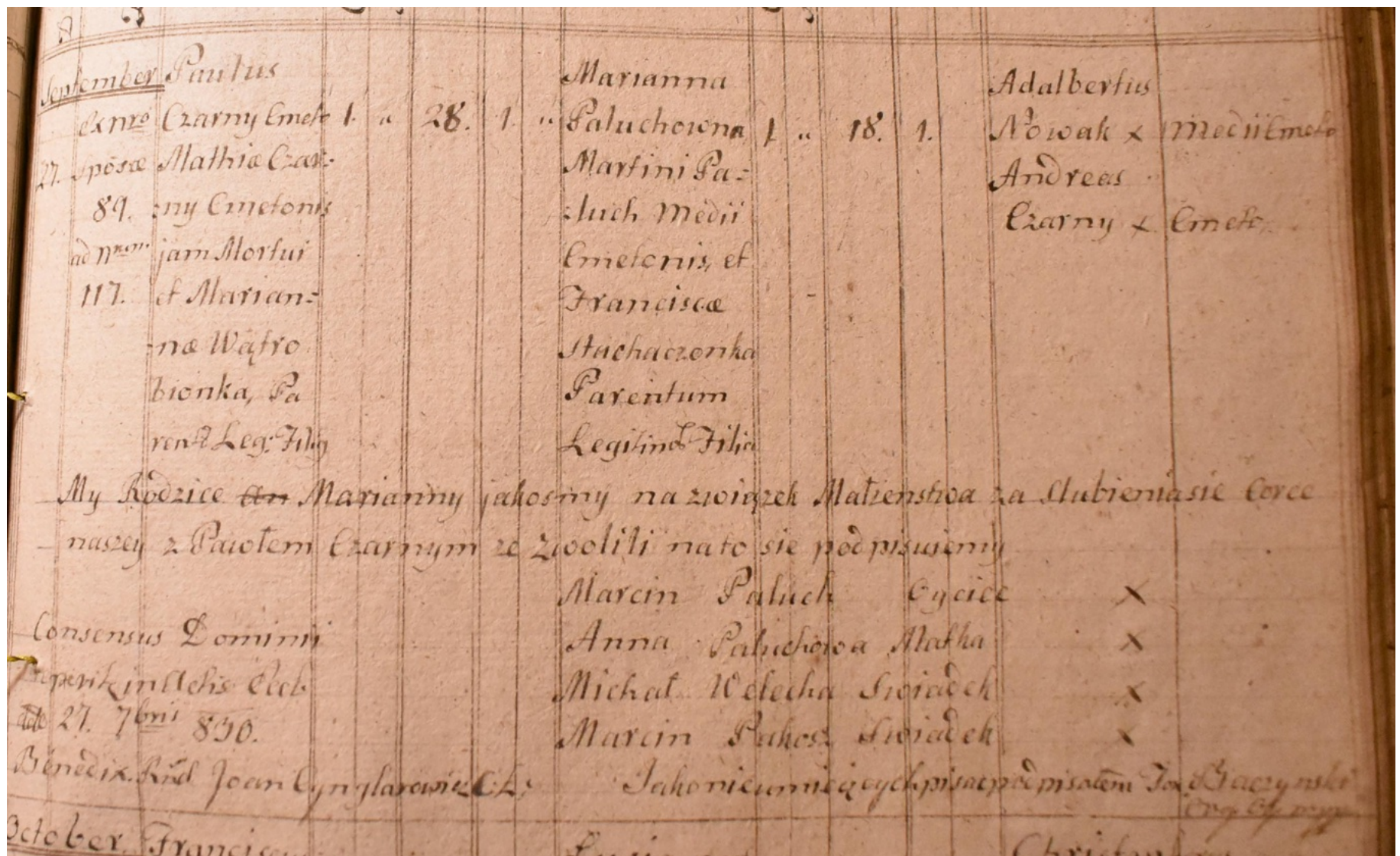

Michael E. Byczek's 3x-great-grandparents were Paul (Paweł) Czarny and Marianna Paluch who were married in 1830 at the Catholic Church located in Osobnica.

The marriage record identified Marianna Paluch's parents as Martin Paluch and Francisca Stachacz. Marianna was living at House #89 in Osobnica. She was recorded as 18 years old with an estimated year of birth as 1812.

Online access to digitized church records for Osobnica is not available for a full year-by-year search. Therefore, it is not possible to determine whether Martin Paluch and Francisca Stachacz were originally from Osobnica or to identify their other children.

There is a discrepancy in the 1830 marriage record of Paul Czarny and Marianna Paluch. The record indicates that Marianna's parents had to consent to the marriage due to her age. Her father was identified in the consent portion as Martin Paluch, but her mother was named Anna Paluch. There are two likely explanations. The first is that "Anna" was either a clerical error for Francisca or part of her formal given name (i.e. "Anna Francisca"). The second is that Francisca was deceased and Martin remarried. However, the record does not indicate her mother was dead or that the witness was a step-mother.

Bykowski in 1974 at St. Helen's on Augusta and Oakley in Chicago. They have two children. Michael E. Byczek is the eldest and was born in Bridgeport.

Osobnica is a village in the administrative district of Gmina Jasło, within Jasło County (Subcarpathian Voivodeship in southeastern Poland).
