Thomas Talbot and Hannah McDonald

Thomas Talbot and Hannah McDonald were married in Taunton, MA on 6/21/1852 at St. Mary's Catholic Church. Thomas was 29 and Hannah was about 25 years old.

Both Thomas and Hannah settled in Taunton with members of their families around 1848 during the Irish Famine. Thomas was joined by his brother William. Hannah lived with her brothers John and James. Both Hannah and her brother John interchanged the surnames McDonald and McDonnell. It appears that McDonald may be the better candidate for their real name, but both are equally likely to be accurate.

Thomas Talbot was born in Ballinlonty within the Drom, also known as Drom and Inch, Catholic parish in Co. Tipperary (Ireland). Analysis of records show, on balance of probabilities, that Thomas was the son of John Talbot and Mary Bourke. The family was also associated with the adjacent village of Fishmoyne, both within the same Catholic parish. Thomas was baptized on 4/8/1823. The basis for this conclusion is explained in detail in the "John Talbot and Mary Bourke" documentary. In summary, there appears to only be one Talbot family at the time in the entire Drom and Inch parish. It is verified that John and Mary Talbot had sons named Thomas and William.

The identities of Hannah's parents and her place of birth have not been verified. Analysis of records from Taunton, MA provided one possibility that the McDonald family was also from Co. Tipperary. The best conclusion about Hannah's birth is that she was born around 1827. Hannah (McDonald) Talbot also used the name Hanora.

The Talbot family remained in Taunton through the naturalization process, which was finalized in 1857. They briefly lived in Wisconsin and St. Louis (Missouri) prior to settling in Chicago, IL around 1861. Analysis of city directories show a high likelihood that Thomas, perhaps without Hannah and their children, sought opportunities in California before the family moved from Massachusetts to Wisconsin.

Upon arrival in Chicago, the Talbot family briefly lived near St. Patrick's Church in the West Loop neighborhood on Canal and Van Buren. They purchased real estate on 17th and Wentworth in the South Loop neighborhood where the family lived for about 20 years. Thomas Talbot ran a saloon in their two story building located at 1700 S. Wentworth for about ten years. He began the business shortly before the Great Chicago Fire in 1871 (the area was not destroyed by the fire).

Thomas and Hannah Talbot had at least four children:

The 1900 census lists that Hannah Talbot had two deceased and three living children. While this may have been a mistake, there was a three or four year gap between Edward and James when another child may have been born. This child, if true, was not listed in the 1860 St. Louis census.

Their son Edward H. Talbot married Kittie A. Rooney at Holy Name Cathedral in Chicago, IL in 1880. Kittie was the daughter of prominent early settlers of Chicago William and Julia Rooney. Edward and Kittie Talbot are Michael E. Byczek's 2x-great-grandparents.

Thomas is best remembered for his saloon on 17th and Wentworth, but also worked as a moulder, teamster, and contractor.

James Talbot passed away in 1865 at the age of about seven years old while the family lived on 17th and Wentworth. Thomas Talbot's brother William was living with the family at the saloon when he passed away in 1871. Hannah's brother James joined the Talbot family in St. Louis and Chicago. He passed away in Chicago in 1870 and was most likely living at the saloon, since the Talbot family arranged his funeral and burial. All three are buried together in Thomas and Hannah Talbot's first family plot at Calvary Cemetery in Evanston, IL.

Thomas and Hannah Talbot relocated to the Grand Boulevard neighborhood at 4132 S. Wabash in 1887. All three of their surviving sons also lived the building, including Edward's wife Kittie and their children Frank and Marie.

Thomas Talbot was a member of the Catholic Order of Foresters. The family were parishioners at St. Elizabeth, which was located on the corner of their block. Earlier, the family had been associated with St. John, which was located about one block away from the saloon on 18th and Clark.

Thomas passed away on 12/26/1892 and Hannah on 1/29/1903. Both were living at 4132 S. Wabash. Their funerals were held at St. Elizabeth. Hannah Talbot purchased a new family plot at Calvary after Thomas died and sold the remaining graves in their first plot. Edward and Kittie Talbot's son Edgar was also buried in that first plot.

Buried together at the second Talbot family plot at Calvary with Thomas and Hannah are their (1) son Edward; (2) daughter-in-law Kittie A. Talbot, Edward's first wife; (3) granddaughter Marie Flanagan, daughter of Edward and Kittie Talbot; (4) great-granddaughter Anna Flanagan, Edward and Kittie's granddaughter; (5) son Thomas and his wife Bridget; (6) Edward's second wife Delia Talbot, who was the niece of Thomas Talbot, and her second husband John Hudson; and (7) Delia's brother Thomas, who was also Thomas Talbot's nephew.

Thomas and Hannah Talbot's three sons sold the family home at 4132 S. Wabash after their mother's death in 1903. The family had owned the building for about 16 years.

Hannah (McDonald/McDonnell) Talbot's Maiden Name

Hannah's maiden name only appears on a few documents:

1852 Presumptive Marriage: McDaniel (2) and McDonnell (1)

1855 MA Census in Taunton: John and James McDonald are living with the Talbot family [presume two of Hannah's brothers]

1860 Census (St. Louis) James McDonald is living with the Talbot family [presume Hannah's brother]

1862 son William's baptism at St. Patrick: McDonnell

1870 Burial of Hannah's brother James in Chicago: McDonnell

1900 son Edward and Delia's Marriage: McDonald

1911 son Thomas's Death Certificate: McDonaldson

Analysis

Both Hannah and her brother James interchanged the spelling of McDonald and McDonnell.

Hannah's son Edward only referred to his mother's maiden name once (McDonald). The widow of Hannah's son Thomas, also did so only once (McDonaldson).

The frequency of surnames across all known documents are:

- 4: McDonald/McDonaldson:
- 3: McDonnell
- 2: McDaniel

Conclusion

McDonald is the best candidate for Hannah Talbot's maiden name based on frequency and the usage of that name by her children. However, both surnames are equally likely to be accurate.

Presumptive Marriage of Thomas Talbot and Hannah McDonald/McDonnell

There was a marriage in Taunton for June 21, 1852 at St. Mary Church. This marriage is written three different ways with three different spellings. It is presumed that this is the correct Thomas and Hannah.

Marriage Intention: Thomas Tabut and Hannorah McDaniel Marriage (Civil): Thomas Tabut and Hannah McDaniel Church Record: Thomas Talbot and Ellen McDonnell

Conclusion

This is the same church where Edward was baptized in 1854.


There appears to only be one Thomas Talbot in Taunton, even though there are about five total Talbot families.

Hannah used both names Hannah and Hanora in Chicago.

It is presumed that McDaniel was a spelling error (very similar, especially is the original handwriting was hard to read).

It is also presumed that since the church that wrote Ellen, that may have been a religious interpretation.

Since the name Talbot was also misspelled in the civil records (Tabut), it is equally plausible that Hannah's name was also misspelled (McDaniel versus McDonnell).

It seems unlikely that two Thomas Talbots were married in Taunton on the exact same day.

Therefore, it is presumed that there are two layers of mistakes.

First, the civil records incorrectly list Hannah as McDaniel.

Second, the church incorrectly listed her as Ellen (unless the names are religiously interchangeable)

The witnesses were Martin Hoy and Ann Harrington.

However, it is unknown why there is another set of names written above (Daniel Cosgrove and Ann Cromyn).

It would appear linked as record #3, unless somebody squeezed two marriages into the same record, or perhaps both took place on the same day.

Online sources refer to the original church having be rebuilt after the 1856 Fire on the site of the current rectory before it was moved to East Taunton.

The location of the rectory shows a building with what appears to be a bell tower.

It's hard to confirm from this perspective, but that may be the original church where Thomas and Hannah were married and Edward baptized.




St. Mary Church in Taunton, MA with the rectory across the street.

Online sources also state that the original church burned down in 1856 and may have been moved to East Taunton (?)

The Talbot family would never have seen this church, but the original church would have been in this location.

Hannah:

Age is consistently 1827-1830.

The range 1827-1828 appears the most (four times).

The year 1830 appears twice.

Thomas:

The overall range is 1824-1830.

1824-1826 appears to be the best range as it appears five times.

The range 1827-1830 appears twice.

Early May 1826 appears twice (naturalization papers and death certificate).

However, somebody may have looked at the naturalization papers when he died for his age. May 1 and May 10 could be a mistake.

Naturalization

Thomas Talbot stated that he arrived in New York about 8/26/1848, which was the height of the Irish Potato Famine that lasted from 1845-1848. He filed the first papers in 1854 and finalized his naturalization in 1857, both while living in Taunton. It is presumed that Thomas and Hannah were married in Taunton in 1852. Neither have been verified in the 1850 census. The 1888 Chicago voter registration of Thomas Talbot at 4132 Wabash listed that he became a citizen in 1857 while living in Taunton.

It is unknown where either Thomas or Hannah were living between their arrival and marriage in Taunton. Hannah also listed 1848 as her year of arrival in the 1900 census. When the naturalization documents were finalized in 1857, Thomas stated he had lived in Taunton for six years, which would be about 1851.







Thomas Talbot Probate

Thomas Talbot named his eldest son Edward H. Talbot as his sole beneficiary. It was Edward who would receive all of the Talbot family personal belongings after Hannah Talbot passed away. Thomas expressly requested that his daughter-in-law Kittie Talbot hold the property for their children should Edward pass away prior to his mother Hannah. The other two sons, Thomas and William, would only receive money after Hannah's death and the house at 4132 S. Wabash was sold. Edward and Kittie's son Frank was the only family member to receive any property at the time of Thomas's death, which was a life insurance policy from St. John Church located at 18th and Clark. It is presumed that Thomas purchased the life insurance policy while they were living at 17th and Wentworth.

The Will shown below was a copy entered into a master ledger book maintained by the Cook County court.

Thomas Talbot stated that he was going blind at the time he signed the Will in 1890.



It would appear that Thomas and Hannah are buried in the middle with Anna Flanagan at their feet.

That would imply that bodies were buried in order of death.

Other than Thomas and Hannah, the next four deaths are the four people without a location.

Following the chronology of deaths, the first six were Thomas, Kittie, Hannah, Edward, Thomas, and Bridget. These are probably the six separate graves. After Bridget in 1914, bodies started being buried on top of the others. That would imply that these four missing graves are the two graves on each end.

The cemetery commented that it was up to the family to know where people were buried within the plot.

It makes sense that Thomas and Hannah are buried alone with the baby at their feet. Bodies were most likely stacked along their sides (two to the left and two to the right).

See below for analysis of where Kittie could be buried.

Kittie was the second death. Only Thomas was buried in the six graves at the time. If Edward had his choice where to bury Kittie, it seems logical to have done so in sequence. If Hannah is buried to the south of Thomas, that would suggest Kittie was buried to the north of Thomas. Marie (Talbot) Flanagan is buried to the north of Thomas, suggesting Marie may have been buried with her mother in the same grave.





Thomas and Hannah appear to have been married in Taunton in 1852. It is unknown whether either were living in 1850, or whether Hannah's three presumed brothers were already in Taunton.

Thomas was a moulder when he first arrived in Chicago and was listed as a moulder on Edward's birth record in 1854.

It is curious that there is also a William Talbot who is a moulder living on the same street (but not necessarily the same house) - Presumed to be his brother.

Thomas filed for citizenship the year before (declaration in 1854 and it was also the year that Edward was born).

There is a John and Edward McDonald also living on Market St.

The 1855 census is when John and James were living with the Talbot family and Edward McDonald appears to have been living next door.

This is the year that Thomas was naturalized and the family was already in Wisconsin in 1858. It's possible that Thomas went to California looking for opportunities while Hannah stayed in Taunton.










1875 Birds-Eye View of Taunton, MA. The arrow marks the location of 7 Winthrop (current addressing system).








- 1. It is unknown where they were living before 1863-64, even though they may have been in Chicago for two years at that point.



The former address of 231 S. Canal appears to have been the corner, or near the corner, of Canal and Van Buren.


This is the only known address for the Talbot family during the first three or four years that they lived in Chicago prior to settling at 17th and Wentworth.



The Talbot saloon was located at 1700 S. Wentworth, which was the SW corner of 17th and Wentworth and known at the time as 32 Wentworth. Thomas Talbot purchased the property in 1865 while the family was living across the street on the SE corner of 17th and Wentworth, which was 33 Wentworth at the time. Over the years, the property was also known as 900 S. Wentworth before the addressing system was unified as 1700 S. Wentworth.


Records suggest that the Talbot family may have remained at 33 Wentworth for a few years after purchasing 32 Wentworth. They first appear at the 32 Wentworth residence in the 1870 Chicago directory when Thomas Talbot opened his saloon. The reason is unclear, but the family may have been living and/or working in both buildings during these initial years.

Prior to their residence on the SE corner of 17th and Wentworth, the family lived less than one block away near 17th and LaSalle.





1857 Birds Eye Map of Chicago The Talbot family home at 1700 Wentworth is shown in this map


It is the corner building on New St between New and Old Streets (four buildings in a row) in the center of the image
The building had a side extension (looks like one and one-half width total buildings)
Thomas Talbot purchased the property a few years after the date of this map.



The middle arrow is 17th and Wentworth, according to this map. In this view, there was a two story building where the saloon was located (this might be the saloon).


The top-right arrow marks the point of intersection between Grove and 16th relative to Wentworth

The lower arrow is LaSalle St.

The Talbots are living on 17th and Wentworth (east side of the street). Thomas already owned the saloon location, but they did not live there until 1870.




The right most arrow represents the intersection of Grove and 16th, which is essentially Wentworth.

According to this approximation, there is a large building on 17th, marked by the 2nd arrow from the right.

The left most arrow should be Clark St (note the circular building at base of right-most arrow).


2nd arrow from left would therefore be LaSalle. This is very difficult to determine whether this collection of houses is Clark or LaSalle (that would determine Wentworth)

This might explain the subdivision. If that large building was torn down, the land could have been subdivided and sold.

The Right arrow shows LaSalle street (they lived on SE corner of 17th). The middle arrow shows the SE corner of 17th and Wentworth.




1886 Robinson's Atlas

1700 Wentworth was described as 24 foot wide and 100 foot long with a garage-like structure in the back.

Thomas Talbot sold the building in 1887, so this map reflects the street when the Talbots lived on the corner.

Note: When Thomas sold the property, it was described as 24x100 feet. It's unknown whether the 100 on the map reflects the building itself, or the total lot length.





Thomas Talbot was listed as a saloon owner in the business directory (full page to the left with zoom below - top image)

The residential directory listed Thomas Talbot with a saloon and residence at 32 Wentworth (bottom image)


There are a few possible scenarios to explain why Thomas Talbot purchased 32 Wentworth in 1865, but did not appear to permanently live in the building until 1870:

- 1. 1700 Wentworth may have originally been 33 Wentworth and was renumbered to 32 Wentworth. However, it seems too coincidental that Thomas was a moulder at 33 Wentworth, but a saloonkeeper at 32 Wentworth. This would suggest these two addresses represent two different events.
- 2. Thomas Talbot was trying to maximize profits by renting out the entire building while living/renting across the street.
- 3. The building at 1700 Wentworth was un-inhabitable, and it took Thomas 4-5 years to fix the property.
- 4. The property was empty land, and Thomas built the building. More information is needed about real estate valuation in the area. He bought the property for \$1,000 in 1865 and sold it for \$7,300 in 1887 (22 years later).
- 5. Thomas Talbot owned 33 Wentworth (unknown) and purchased 32 Wentworth as an investment. Five years later, he took the building over to open a saloon.

The 1886 Robinson insurance map indicates that the left side of the building (south) was an irregular shape. Compare this to the 1857 Birds Eye Map, which appears to match this irregular shape.


Therefore, the 1857 Birds Eye Map and 1886 Robinson Map appears to reflect a similar irregular building. This would suggest either (1) it's the same building, or (2) the original building was rebuilt with the same irregular shape.

The side-by-side image shows that the buildings on the 1857 Birds Eye are not all the same compared to the 1886 Robinson, especially two buildings south. Therefore, there was rebuilding amongst these buildings to some degree between 1857 and 1886, or the Birds Eye Map is not entirely drawn with accuracy or scale.




Side-by-side views of the 1886 Robinson Insurance and the 1857 Birds Eye Map $\,$


It is also unknown when the house was built, or whether Thomas Talbot purchased vacant land.






4132 S. Wabash 1890 Rascher Insurance Map

The garage is perhaps one story (compared to neighbors with two) and the door on the side.






