

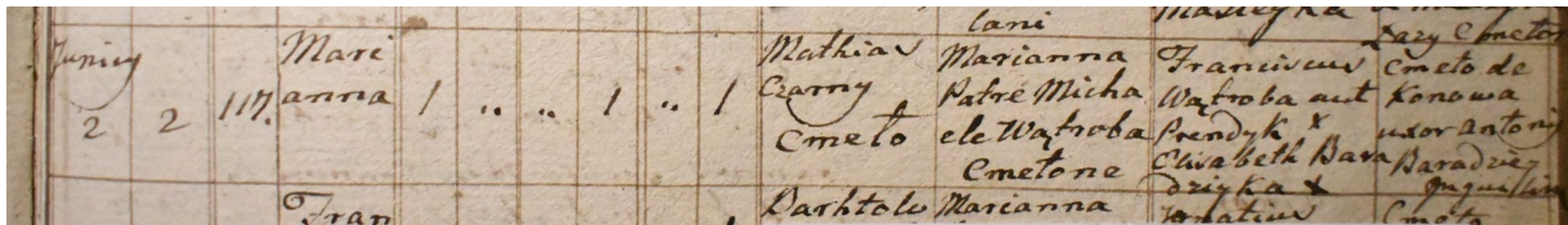

Michael E. Byczek's 4x-great-grandparents were Matthias (Maciej) Czarny and Marianna Wątroba who were married in 1793 at the Catholic Church located in Osobnica.

Marianna Wątroba was recorded as 16 years old when she was married with an estimated year of birth as 1777. The baptism records for her children identified her father as Michael (Michał) Wątroba. The available digitized church records for Osobnica do not permit a complete year-by-year search. However, a baptism record was found for a baby named Marianna whose parents were Michael and Margaret (Małgorzata) Wątroba. She was baptized in Osobnica on 3/19/1778. Although Marianna's mother is not identified in the known records, the 1778 baptism most likely pertains to her on the balance of probabilities.

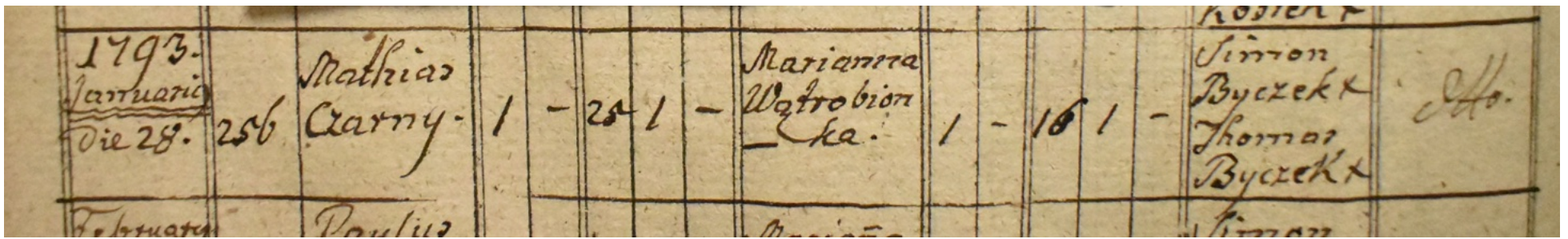
The 1816 baptism of Marianna Czarny was the earliest baptism record for the family that explicitly identified Marianna's father as Michael Wątroba.

Byczek (grandfather) married Marie Flanagan in 1950 at St. Bridget's in Bridgeport. Their son Michael M. Byczek (father) married Betty A. Bykowski in 1974 at St. Helen's on Augusta and Oakley in Chicago. They have two children. Michael E. Byczek is the eldest and was born in Bridgeport.

Osobnica is a village in the administrative district of Gmina Jasło, within Jasło County (Subcarpathian Voivodeship in southeastern Poland).
